Want to become a judge?


INJA judges must be qualified prior to becoming a judge. Our goal in having qualified people become judges is through their education. For this reason we require that all participants are professionals with a minimum of 5 years experience.

In addition we require one of the following:

- International master champions that have won globally recognized competitions.
- Educators with 4 years experience teaching as a globally recognized educator.
- Internationally recognized judges.

ADDITIONAL REQUIREMENTS AS 2017

- Experience as a competitor. It is not required to win a trophy, but we want the judges to
 understand what the competitor go through and experience at least one time.
- Prior to attending judge certificate program, everyone must earn their INJA competition training certificates by attending the four official INJA courses offered by certified INJA judges.
- INJA judges must attend a 2 day training course and pass an extensive exam and must attend a re-certification course every two years.
- All judges start their first judging experience as a floor judge for an official INJA competition.



French Competitions: includes French sculptured acrylic, French sculptured gel, White tip acrylic student division, Pink& white gel tip overlay student division, Salon style French, Gel open, Cover French extension, and Stiletto French.

Soak Off Gel Competitions: includes Red soak off gel manicure, Traditional soak off gel, French soak off manicure, Fashion design soak off gel manicure, and Salon trend soak off gel manicure.

Hands On Nail Art Competitions: includes Design sculpture, Design gel extension, Stiletto nail art, Nail art embellishment, Ultimate nail art challenge, French twist(Tradition and stiletto), and Salon style nail art enhancement.

Submitted Nail Art Competitions: includes Flat art, Fantasy nail art, Fantasy art tip box, Mix media/box art, 3D nail art tip box, Living art, Salon trend pedicure art, Salon trend art tip box, and Nail art embellishment tip box.
